We are seeking a teaching position at the assistant professor, associate professor, or professor level in Taiwan, Austronesia, and Global Indigenous Studies. We are also considering applications from lecturers. The position will be effective on August 1, 2025.

The role includes (but is not limited to) curriculum and assessment design, research outputs, and expanding international scholarly collaborations. You will also perform research, administrative and other activities associated with the Program.

Eligibility

- Ph.D. in Indigenous Studies, Humanities, Social Science, or Law.
- Experience in using English as a medium of instruction.
- Practical experience in working with indigenous communities in Taiwan or overseas.
- Suppose the recruited individual is a recent graduate who has not yet obtained a doctoral degree. They should provide a provisional degree certificate and relevant supporting documents in that case.
